8 subsequently ordered by this Court to be placed in an interest-bearing account

12 On June 7, 2000 this Court entered its Third Amended Order for
13 Deposit and Transfer of Settlement Proceeds ("Third Amended Order"). The

16 2000, upon application by the Governments, the Court entered an Order Re:
