            CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Someone would need to go

8 acquisitions Department of Law and Department of Justice go to
9 court for the money once a purchase agreement is executed.
10 Because on a couple of acquisition we're virtually doing the
11 purchase agreements and the closings almost on the same day, if
12 not with just a few days in between. And also because we're
13 trying to minimize the number of court requests that we have
14 while Gina Belt is on leave.
15
        For this reason the request is for certain select
16 acquisitions to get permission to go to the court to obtain
17 funding prior to execution of the purchase agreements. And
18 those parcels are a couple of small parcels, KAP-220, KAP-226
19 and KENAI-1034, and then also for the Afognak Joint Venture
20 acquisition.
21
        The motion that's being proposed to you is to amend the
22 resolutions that reference those acquisitions to permit the
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23 withdrawal of funds prior to the execution of the purchase 24 agreements, subject to a number of conditions. And I should 25 mention here that these conditions and this draft have been

- 1 reviewed by all of the State and Federal attorneys and the 2 version that you have in front of you reflects their changes. MS. D. WILLIAMS: Okay. Mr. Chairman. 4 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Deborah, yes. 5 MS. D. WILLIAMS: I move to adopt the 6 resolution as described by Ms. McCammon and in front of us. 7 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Do we have a second? MS. BROWN: Second. This is Michele. 8 9 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Okay. We have a second from 10 Michele Brown. Any discussion? (No audible responses) 11 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: I have one question while 12 13 people are thinking about it and it's only because we have two 14 different versions here. And Item B, under the conditions in 15 one version say, the governments and the Executive Director, 16 and the other one says the United States Department of 17 Interior, the State of Alaska and the Executive Director must
- 18 certify prior to closing. Which is the final? 19 MR. SWIDERSKI: The one that says the United --20 this is Alex Swiderski, Mr. Chairman. The one that says United 21 States Department of Interior.
- 22 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Okay. Very good. Any other 23 comments?
- 24 (No audible responses)
- 25 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Okay. Well, shall we have a

We 20 hope and anticipate that that will be signed pretty 21 expeditiously and we hope that when we do go to the court for 22 the next disbursement for these parcels that we will be using 23 electronic transfer. 24 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: That's good news.

MR. ROTH: The effect of which is we're

- 1 implementing one of the GAO recommendations.
- 2 MR. TILLERY: And also, for example, in this
- 3 particular thing, it'll save us at least \$15,000 for this
- 4 particular disbursement.
- 5 MS. D. WILLIAMS: Good.
- 6 CHAIRMAN WOLFE: Good is right.
