State of Alaska</u>, No. A91-081 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and after public meetings, unanimous agreement has been reached to expend funds received in settlement of <u>State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-083 CIV, and <u>United States of America v. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-082 CIV, in U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska. This funding is for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities for the Annual Program Development and Implementation Budget (APDI), as described in Attachment A, and the FY 2011 Budget Summary All Projects - Final, as described in Attachment B. The total amount of approved funding is \$4,686,848. The monies are to be distributed according to the following schedule:
