The United States and the State of Alaska ("the Governments") jointly provide this notice ("Notice") of their expenditure of \$7,310,443 from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Investment Fund ("Investment Fund"). The Governments' natural resource trustee agencies will use these funds for purposes consistent with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by this Court in *United States v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081 CIV (D. Alaska), on August 28, 1991 ("MOA").

Sixty-Eighth Joint Notice Of Expenditures From Investment Fund (Case 3:91-CV-0083 (HRH))

On September 25, 1991, the United States and the State of Alaska settled their claims against the Exxon Corporation, Exxon Shipping Company, Exxon Pipeline Company, and the T/V Exxon Valdez arising from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill ("EVOS"). All funds resulting from these settlements were subsequently ordered by this Court to be placed in an interest-bearing account in the Court Registry Investment System ("CRIS") administered through the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas.

On June 7, 2000, this Court entered its Third Amended Order for Deposit and Transfer of Settlement Proceeds ("Third Amended Order"). The Third Amended Order allows the Governments the option of investing the money in an account outside the United States Treasury. On September 29, 2000, upon application by the Governments, the Court entered an Order Re: Transfer of Funds from the Exxon Valdez Liquidity Account and the Reserve Fund to an Investment Fund Within the Alaska Department of Revenue, Division of Treasury, authorizing transfer of settlement proceeds to an account within the State. On October 5, 2000, all funds and securities were transferred from the CRIS to the Investment Fund. The Third Amended Order further allows the Governments to establish separate sub-accounts within the primary account "as the Trustee Council determines appropriate." On October 1, 2002, three sub-accounts were created in the Investment Fund: the Research Investment Sub-Account, the Habitat Investment Sub-Account, and the Koniag Investment Sub-Account. These sub-accounts were established to carry out the Trustee Council's decision in its Resolution of March 1, 1999 to manage separately the remaining assets of the Joint Trust Funds for the specific purposes of funding a long term research and monitoring program, the acquisition of lands along the Karluk River, and the establishment of a fund to purchase small parcels of land that may become available in the

Paragraph 27 of the Third Amended Order provides that "funds in an Investment Fund shall remain on deposit in that Fund until such time as the EVOS Trustees unanimously resolve to expend all or part of the funds." The funds may then be expended, for purposes consistent with the MOA, upon the joint notification of the Governments to the Investment Fund and the Court. The notification is to inform the Court of the proposed uses of the funds in the same manner and to the same extent as was the Governments' practice when the funds were in the registry of the Court.<sup>2</sup>

The Governments provide Notice of this sixty-eighth expenditure in the amount of \$5,037,958 from the Research Sub-Account, which includes \$4,571,658 in newly disbursed funds and \$466,300 in previously disbursed funds, for Fiscal Year 2018 Restoration Projects.<sup>3</sup> The Governments also provide Notice of the expenditure of \$2,272,485 from the Habitat Sub-Account, which includes \$1,338,785 in newly disbursed funds and \$933,700 in previously disbursed funds, for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities for

The Koniag Sub-Account funds, which had been set aside for the protection, and potential purchase, of certain lands on Kodiak Island held by Koniag, Inc. (Koniag), were transferred to the Habitat Sub-Account on March 14, 2014 after the final payment due Koniag (after its termination of the Master Agreement for Protection of Certain Lands and Resources Between Koniag, Inc., the United States of America, and the State of Alaska and associated easements) was made, and the Koniag Investment Sub-Account was terminated. The payment was the subject of the Governments' Fifty-Fifth Joint Notice of Expenditures from the Investment Fund.

Of the \$7,310,443 that is the subject of this Notice, \$5,366,302 will be provided to the United States (in addition to \$300,000 in previously disbursed funds), and \$544,141 will be provided to the State of Alaska (in addition to \$1,100,000 in previously disbursed funds).

The Trustee Council has met once since the Governments' filing on September 27, 2017 of their Sixty-Seventh Joint Notice of Expenditures. The Governments will submit the meeting notes for the Trustee Council's last meeting on November 14, 2017 once they have been approved by the Trustee Council. The meeting notes for the Trustee Council's meeting on January 11, 2017 are appended to this Notice as Attachment B.

This letter is intended to correct or clarify a few statements in the first paragraph of the letter Erika Wells and I sent to you via email on December 14, 2017. The first paragraph of that letter provided as follows:

The Exxon Valdez Trustee Council has unanimously determined to expend \$7,310,443 in joint trust funds for restoration purposes consistent with the terms of the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by the federal district court in United States v. State of Alaska, No. A91-081 CIV (D. Alaska). This expenditure consists of \$5,037,958 from the Research sub-Account and \$2,272,485 from the Habitat sub-account, both of which are sub-accounts of the Investment Fund of the State of Alaska, Department of Natural Resources, as well as \$1,400,000 in previously-disbursed funds presently held in the United States' DOI NRDAR account and the State of Alaska's ADF&G IRIS Fund 3386.

There are two clarifications required for the paragraph above. The first is that in the second (final) sentence, the phrase "as well as \$1,400,000 in previously-disbursed funds" should be changed to read "including \$1,400,000 in previously-disbursed funds." The second clarification is that a new sentence should be added to the end of the paragraph that reads "The \$5,037,958 in Research funds includes \$466,300 in previously disbursed funds, and the \$2,272,485 in Habitat funds includes \$933,700 in previously disbursed funds."

We, the undersigned, duly authorized members of the *Exxon Valdez* Oil Spill Trustee Council do hereby certify that, in accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered as settlement of *United States of America v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and after public meetings, unanimous agreement has been reached to expend funds received in settlement of *State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.*, No. A91-083 CIV, and *United States of America v. Exxon Corporation, et al.*, No. A91-082 CIV, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska. This funding is for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities as described below.

SECTION I: FY18 Work Plan of EVOSTC Restoration, Research, and Monitoring Projects and FY18 EVOSTC Annual Budget

#### A. Funding Authorized in Section I

The total amount of funding approved in Section I is \$7,310,443. This funding is approved for February 1, 2018 through January 31, 2019, except where otherwise noted below. The lead or managing agency for each project must demonstrate to the Executive Director, where applicable, that requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) are met before any project funds may be expended (with the exception of funds to prepare NEPA documentation); and the Principal Investigators for the project must abide by the Council's policies, including those pertaining to data and reporting.

This funding must be spent in accordance with the FY18 Annual Funding Overview (AFO), dated November 14, 2017 and the documents referenced therein including and as described by the FY18 EVOSTC Annual Budget, dated November 14, 2017. In addition, the funds must be spent in accordance with any additional requirements, conditions or information described in Section I (B).

### B. Additional Requirements, Conditions and Other Information

The additional requirements, conditions and other information below are in addition to any requirements, conditions or other information in Sections I (A).

- 1. FY18 EVOSTC Annual Budget—Project 18180100: To support the FY18 Alaska Marine Science Symposium, \$10,000 plus GA is included in the Budget. To support outreach activities, \$10,000 plus GA is included in the Budget. Both of these amounts are authorized as of December 1, 2017.
- 2. State Parks Kenai River Flats Riverbank Restoration Project 17170116: The Council approves \$327,000, which includes GA, for the reauthorization of State Parks Riverbank Restoration and Protection, Kenai River Flats Project, dated August 31, 2017. This reauthorization is authorized until May 1, 2019.

#### SECTION II: HABITAT PARCEL

#### A. Funding Authorized in Section II

The total amount of funding approved in Section II is \$5,200,000.

Authorization for funding for the purchase of interests in the parcel noted in Section II (B) shall terminate if a purchase agreement is not executed by May 1, 2019. This funding must be spent in accordance with the activities, requirements, conditions and information as described in Section II (B).

### B. <u>Habitat Parcel Additional Requirements, Conditions and Other Information</u>

The additional requirements, conditions and other information below are in addition to any requirements, conditions or other information in Sections II (A). The Council is approving funding for the protection of the **PWS 4009 Port Valdez-Meals Hill** parcel with the purchase of interests in land to be at the fair market value established by an approved appraisal and the total cost of which, including due diligence, initial enhancements for public use and closing costs, shall not exceed \$5,200,000.

a. the provision that the EVOSTC Executive Director, in consultation with the Alaska

The DNR Land Administration Records (LAS) and the EVOSTC Habitat Protection and Acquisition Catalog require periodic review and updates of land status. The Catalog was last updated in 2006 and DNR, at the direction of the Council office, is currently working on an update. This task includes intensive title research and identifying LAS data that is incorrect with regard to EVOSTC-funded properties and includes researching what projects took place in the interim, researching each project to determine the interests acquired and the associated costs, writing project narratives and creating associated GIS maps, including resolution of land status discrepancies. Correcting this data will allow DNR reference maps to display accurate land status for such properties. Accurate record keeping and maintenance is vital to the overall management of EVOSTC lands and for the dissemination of information, including in responding to inquiries by the public, media and governmental agencies.

With the reorganization in 2009-2011, the Restoration Program's need for ARLIS services was expected to diminish and ARLIS's funding was reduced.
