The United States and the State of Alaska ("the Governments") jointly provide this notice ("Notice") of their expenditure of \$10,895,777 from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Investment Fund ("Investment Fund"). This expenditure consists of \$10,740,895 from the Habitat Sub-Account of the Investment Fund and \$154,882 from the Research Sub-Account of the Investment Fund. The Governments' natural resource trustee agencies will use these funds for purposes consistent with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by this Court in *United States v*.

State of Alaska, No. A91-081 CIV (D. Alaska), on August 28, 1991 ("MOA").

On September 25, 1991, the United States and the State of Alaska settled their claims against the Exxon Corporation, Exxon Shipping Company, Exxon Pipeline Company, and the T/V Exxon Valdez arising from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill ("EVOS"). All funds resulting from these settlements were subsequently ordered by this Court to be placed in an interest-bearing account in the Court Registry Investment System ("CRIS") administered through the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas.

On June 7, 2000, this Court entered its Third Amended Order for Deposit and Transfer of Settlement Proceeds ("Third Amended Order"). The Third Amended Order allows the Governments the option of investing the money in an account outside the United States Treasury. On September 29, 2000, upon application by the Governments, the Court entered an Order Re: Transfer of Funds from the Exxon Valdez Liquidity Account and the Reserve Fund to an Investment Fund Within the Alaska Department of Revenue, Division of Treasury, authorizing transfer of settlement proceeds to an account within the State. On October 5, 2000, all funds and securities were transferred from the CRIS to the Investment Fund. The Third Amended Order further allows the Governments to establish separate sub-accounts within the primary account "as the Trustee Council determines appropriate." On October 1, 2002, three sub-accounts were created in the Investment Fund: the Research Investment Sub-Account, the Habitat Investment Sub-Account, and the Koniag Investment Sub-Account. These sub-accounts were established to carry out the Trustee Council's decision in its Resolution of March 1, 1999 to manage separately the remaining assets of the Joint Trust Funds for the specific purposes of funding a long term research and monitoring program, the acquisition of lands along the Karluk River, and the establishment of a fund to purchase small parcels of land that may become available in the

Paragraph 27 of the Third Amended Order provides that "funds in an Investment Fund shall remain on deposit in that Fund until such time as the EVOS Trustees unanimously resolve to expend all or part of the funds." The funds may then be expended, for purposes consistent with the MOA, upon the joint notification of the Governments to the Investment Fund and the Court. The notification is to inform the Court of the proposed uses of the funds in the same manner and to the same extent as was the Governments' practice when the funds were in the registry of the Court.²

The Governments provide Notice of this sixty-ninth expenditure in the amount of \$10,740,895 from the Habitat Sub-Account, which includes three habitat enhancement projects.³ The Governments also provide Notice of the expenditure of \$154,882 from the Research Sub-Account for one addition to the Fiscal Year 2018 EVOSTC Annual Budget, and additional funding for new public outreach activities.⁴

The Koniag Sub-Account has been terminated. The funds previously held in that sub-account were transferred to the Habitat Sub-Account on March 14, 2014. See Fifty-Fifth Joint Notice of Expenditures from the Investment Fund. Dkt. No. 349.

A copy of the notices provided to the Investment Fund pursuant to paragraph 27 of the Third Amended Order for Deposit and Transfer of Settlement Proceeds are appended to this Notice as Attachment A, pp. 1-4.

The Trustee Council unanimously authorized these expenditures at its April 9, 2018 meeting in Resolution 18-01. Appendix A, pp. 5-44. A description of the Kenai Watershed Forum - Stream Watch Program, the Copper River Watershed Enhancement Project, and the Portage Lake Project is in Section II of Resolution 18-01. A further description of the Portage Lake Project is appended to this Notice as Attachment A, pp. 39-44.

The Trustee Council unanimously authorized these expenditures at its April 9, 2018 meeting in Resolution 18-01. These include \$14,170 for Trustee agency and Trustee Council staff travel during a spring 2018 visit to Alaska by the Government Accountability Office, and \$140,712 for Alaska Department of Natural Resources to conduct additional outreach activities

Of the \$10,895,777 that is the subject of this Notice, \$930,895 will be provided to the United States, and \$9,964,882 will be provided to the State of Alaska.

The Governments also provide notice of a correction to their Sixty-Third Joint Notice of Expenditures filed on December 21, 2016. Dkt. No. 383. That Notice incorrectly stated that the \$1,000,000 in previously disbursed funding that was the subject of the Notice had been previously disbursed from the United States Department of the Interior Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration Fund; the \$1,000,000 funding was previously disbursed from the State of Alaska ADF&G IRIS Fund 3386.

The Trustee Council has met once since the Governments' filing on January 10, 2018 of their Sixty-Eighth Joint Notice of Expenditures. The Governments will submit the meeting notes for the Trustee Council's last meeting on April 9, 2018, once they have been approved by the Trustee Council. The meeting notes for the Trustee Council's meeting on November 14, 2017 are appended to this Notice as Attachment B.

We, the undersigned, duly authorized members of the *Exxon Valdez* Oil Spill Trustee Council do hereby certify that, in accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered as settlement of *United States of America v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and after public meetings, unanimous agreement has been reached to expend funds received in settlement of *State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.*, No. A91-083 CIV, and *United States of America v. Exxon Corporation, et al.*, No. A91-082 CIV, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska. This funding is for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities as described below.

SECTION I: FY18 Work Plan of EVOSTC Restoration, Research, and Monitoring Projects and FY18 EVOSTC Annual Budget

A. Funding Authorized in Section I

The total amount of funding approved in Section I is \$225,732. This funding is approved for April 9, 2018 through April 9, 2019. The lead or managing agency for each project must demonstrate to the Executive Director, where applicable, that requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) are met before any project funds may be expended (with the exception of funds to prepare NEPA documentation); and the Principal Investigators for the project must abide by the Council's policies, including those pertaining to data and reporting.

This funding must be spent in accordance with the FY18 Annual Funding Overview (AFO), dated November 14, 2017, revised March 26, 2018, and the documents referenced therein including and as described by the FY18 EVOSTC Annual Budget, dated March 26, 2018, as amended by

the Council at its meeting on April 9, 2018. In addition, the funds must be spent in accordance with any additional requirements, conditions or information described in Section I (B).

B. Additional Requirements, Conditions and Other Information

The additional requirements, conditions and other information below are in addition to any requirements, conditions or other information in Sections I (A).

1. FY18 EVOSTC Annual Budget - Project 18180100:

- a. The Council approves funding to support travel by Trust agency and EVOSTC representatives during the Government Accountability Office (GAO) Spring 2018 visit to Alaska in the amount of \$14,170, which includes General Administration (GA).
- b. The Council approves funding for additional Outreach Activities in the amount of \$109,000, which includes GA, for interpretive services and products to enhance public education about EVOS and aspects of the restoration work funded by the Council. Of this \$35,000 has been allocated to ADNR (below) leaving \$70,850 remaining to be released per decision by the Executive Director at a later date.

2. FY18 ADNR Outreach Activities - Project 18180119:

The Council approves funding for additional ADNR Outreach Activities in the amount of \$140,712, which includes GA, for interpretive services and products to enhance public education about EVOS and aspects of the restoration work funded by the Council. This amount includes \$35,000 from additional outreach money.

SECTION II: HABITAT PARCELS AND HABITAT ENHANCEMENT PROJECTS

A. Funding Authorized in Section II

The total amount of funding approved in Section II is \$24,696,567. This funding must be spent in accordance with the activities, requirements, conditions and information as described in Section II (B & C).

B. Habitat Parcel Additional Requirements, Conditions and Other Information

The additional requirements, conditions and other information below are in addition to any requirements, conditions or other information in Sections II (A). The Council is approving funding for the protection of the following parcels with the purchase of interests in land to be at the fair market value established by an approved appraisal and the total cost of which,

including due diligence, initial enhancements for public use and closing costs, shall not exceed the amount noted for each parcel:

- Parcel KAP 4000, Portage Lake price adjustment, Kodiak: \$11,500,000 (\$8,500,000 previously authorized in Resolution 16-02; this resolution authorizes the increased amount);
- 2. Parcel KAP 4012, Koniag Subsurface, Kodiak: \$3,000,000;
- 3. Parcel KEN 4010, Shuey, Kenai: \$600,000; and
- 4. Parcel KEN 4011, Lofstedt, Kenai: \$800,000.

The purchases above are further conditioned upon:

- a. due diligence reports, which are acceptable to the Alaska Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Department of Interior Solicitor's Office and the Alaska Department of Law.
- b. the provision that the EVOSTC Executive Director, in consultation with the Alaska Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Department of Interior Solicitor's Office and Alaska Department of Law, determines that it is in the interest of the Council to move forward with purchase of the interests in the Parcels; and

Authorization for funding for the purchase of interests in these Parcels shall terminate if purchase agreements are not executed by October 31, 2019.

C: Habitat Enhancement Projects

Authorization for funding for projects in Section II(C) is approved for April 9, 2018 through October 31, 2019.

1. Copper River Watershed Enhancement Project 18180120: The Council approves funding of \$8,152,070, which includes GA, for the Copper River Watershed Enhancement Project to remove and replace 13 priority culverts for the restoration benefits under EVOS. One additional culvert within the project area will be replaced by EVOSTC project partner Alaska Department of Transportation.

- 2. Kenai Watershed Forum: Stream Watch Program Project 18180117: The Council approves funding \$99,497, which includes GA, for the Kenai Watershed Forum: Stream Watch Program to support additional stream protection activities on the southern Kenai Peninsula, around the stream and river mouths of the Kasilof, Ninilchik and Anchor Rivers and Deep Creek for the 2018 and 2019 summer field seasons.
- **3. Kenai Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration Project 15150123:** The Council approves funding \$545,000, which includes GA, for the Kenai Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration Project.

SECTION III: APPROVAL BY COUNCIL

By unanimous consent, we hereby request the Alaska Department of Law and the Assistant
Attorney General of the Environment and Natural Resources Division of the United States
Department of Justice to take such steps as may be necessary to make available the funding as described in this Resolution and approved by the Executive Director.

The Council's FY18 Annual Budget is funded by the *Exxon Valdez* Oil Spill Investment Fund Research and Habitat sub-accounts, which are managed by the Alaska Department of Revenue. Agreed-Upon Services Contract

Overview:

The Portage Lake project was previously approved for purchase by the Council for \$8,500,000 (Council Resolution 16-02). Significant work has proceeded toward completing this purchase, but changes in the timber market have resulted in a higher than estimated total purchase price of up to \$11,500,000. The requested amount would reauthorize purchase of the Portage Lake property and increase the amount up to a total of \$11,500,000, subject to the final appraised value. The final purchase may proceed in two phases as determined by a survey that is presently underway.

The project encompasses approximately 2880 acres surrounding Portage Lake on northern Afognak Island. The property is contiguous to Portage Lake, Portage Creek and the Portage Creek Estuary in Discoverer Bay. The Portage Lake property is accessed by float plane at Portage Lake, the existing road network on Afognak Island, or by boat in Discoverer Bay.

As described in the Proposed Management section, this property on Afognak Island will be managed by the State of Alaska, Department of Natural Resources and consistent with the management of Afognak Island State Park. Natives of Kodiak owns the surface estate and Koniag, Inc. owns the subsurface rights to the property. This acquisition involves the surface estate. The fair market value of property will be determined by an appraisal compliant with EVOSTC, USPAP, and UASFLA appraisal standards and reviewed by a State of Alaska approved review appraiser. Closing may be in two stages with the approval of the parties.

The Kodiak Archipelago contains high-priority habitat for EVOS species recovery and habitat protection. Protection of this large, ecologically-rich area contiguous to other EVOSTC protection projects would contribute to EVOSTC mission of ecosystem and species recovery and maintenance in the Kodiak Archipelago. EVOS-affected species in the Kodiak archipelago are dependent on the coastal, riverine, wetland, and upland habitats provided by the Portage Lake property. Protection of Portage Lake would complete a contiguous protected wildlife corridor between Afognak Island State Park and the Red Peak unit of the Kodiak Island National Wildlife Refuge for fish, shore birds, sea birds, migratory birds, and terrestrial and marine mammal species.

Protection of Portage Lake builds on Past Council Actions:

The Portage Lake protection project furthers the efforts of past EVOS Trustee Council actions focusing on Afognak Island.

In 1993, with Council support, the State acquired surface title to 41,549 acres on northern Afognak Island. This mature spruce forest is adjacent to highly productive marine waters, includes anadromous fish streams, and provides excellent habitat for bald eagles and marbled murrelet nesting. In 1994, the Alaska State Legislature designated these lands as the Afognak Island State Park.

In 1998, with Council support, the Afognak Joint Venture (AJV) transferred to the state and federal governments surface title to approximately 41,376 acres of land on northern Afognak Island and easements on an additional 400 acres.

In 2016, with Council support, the Ouzinkie Native Corporation transferred to State and federal governments surface title to 36,364 acres of land on northern Afognak Island and the Triplet Islands to be managed for conservation purposes. The Portage Lake property is directly adjacent to the lands acquired from Ouzinke.

Property Description and Habitat:

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service identifies Afognak Island among the most productive habitat in the Gulf of Alaska. The Portage Lake lands contain saltwater and freshwater access points, approximately three river and stream miles, and one navigable lake. Of the three river and stream miles, each of the miles support anadromous species identified in the Alaska Department of Fish and Game's Anadromous Waters Catalogue, including four species of Pacific salmon. This includes Portage Lake, which is a sockeye system. The property contains three miles of coastline in Discoverer Bay serving coastal wildlife communities such as seabirds identified as EVOS-affected species, Steller sea lions and sea otters. Fish and Wildlife Service's National Wetlands Inventory shows the property contains approximately 750 acres of wetland habitat. The Portage Lake lands also contain Sitka Spruce, salmonberry, and blueberry, among other native plant species. The property contains a mix of virgin forest and land where the timber has been harvested. The property is unimproved except for logging roads.

Restoration Benefits:

A number of EVOS-affected species would benefit from the protection of the Portage Lake property, including Pigeon Guillemots, sea otters, cutthroat trout, sockeye salmon, pink salmon, Dolly Varden, and bald eagles. Protection of Portage Lake would provide permanent habitat protection for these species and assist the EVOSTC in reaching and maintaining its recovery objectives in the Kodiak Archipelago.

The Portage Lake property also contains significant wetlands, including Fish and Wildlife Service-identified nationally declining wetlands. Significant portions of these wetlands are functionally connected. Estuarine wetlands on or adjacent to the property provide habitat for Intertidal Communities and other EVOS-affected species. Marine wetlands provide habitat for Subtidal Communities. Palustrine wetlands filter water entering lakes and streams used by fish and bird Injured Species. Palustrine and riverine wetlands also provide spawning habitat for sockeye salmon, pink salmon, and Dolly Varden. Protection of the property would assure high function of these wetlands, which would benefit EVOS-affected species.

The Portage Lake lands connect a habitat corridor between the Afognak Island State Park with the recent Ouzinkie Native Corporation protection and the Kodiak Island National Wildlife Refuge. These lands provide essential habitat and migratory grounds for more than 250 species of fish, birds, and mammals. The natural abundance and wild setting attract thousands of visitors to the Wildlife Refuge and State Park annually; addition of this property would benefit recreation and tourism, which were also identified by the EVOSTC as an Injured Service. In addition, the purchase of the property would benefit subsistence harvest levels, which is identified as an Injured Human Service.

Potential Threats:

Conservation of Portage Lake would eliminate the threat of future habitat fragmentation, road construction, subdivision, development and industrialization of northern Afognak Island. Without this purchase, these lands could be available for subdivision of recreational parcels around Portage Lake and sale of timber on the property like much of the adjacent land.

Conserving contiguous tracts of land reduces habitat fragmentation and thus removes barriers to species mobility. Species' ability to freely move across landscapes ensures a greater rate of reproductive success, greater access to food, and more opportunity to establish territory in higher-quality habitat. When populations experience barriers to reproduction, they are at greater risk of experiencing a decline in genetic diversity, and a decrease in genetic diversity decreases a population's ability to adapt to a changing environment and can increase the effect of deleterious alleles on the population. Conserving contiguous tracts of lands also protects pathways between resources. Ample access to resources reduces species stress and makes them less susceptible to disease and starvation.

Proposed Management:

Alaska Department of Natural Resources; conservation easement to the US/BLM.

Funding Request:

To be determined upon completion of appraisal – Not to exceed \$11,500,000, including due diligence and closing costs.


