ABSTRACT

Project management supports those Trustee agencies that administer and/or implement EVOS projects on behalf of the Trustee Council. Tasks performed by project managers include coordinating activities between principal investigators and the Trustee Council Office, reviewing project expenditure activity, assisting in the development of project proposals, and tracking project reports.

INTRODUCTION

The FY 03 proposal for project management reflects Trustee Council guidance to continue reductions in overall programmatic and administrative costs consistent with the size of the restoration program. The FY 03 funding amount of \$137,600 represents a sizable reduction from the amount approved for project management in FY 02 (\$181,700).

NEED FOR THE PROJECT

The project manager provides a link between the Trustee Council Office and the principal investigators. Project managers are to:

- Attend the annual Restoration Workshop;
- Attend Restoration Work Force meetings (roughly 2 a year);
- Ensure that projects are implemented consistent with the Trustee Council's policies and procedures and/or state and federal procedures, including NEPA compliance;
- Monitor projects to ensure they meet their stated goals, objectives and schedules consistent with the funding authorized;
- Administer contracts that implement approved projects, including reviewing and approving invoices:
- Submit quarterly project reports to the Trustee Council Office, and ensure that annual and final reports and other contract deliverables are acceptable;
- Facilitate the printing/distribution of project reports to ARLIS; and
- Track the inventory of equipment (with an original per unit cost of \$5,000) purchased with Joint Trust Funds.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Project managers for each project are available to the public to answer questions and provide information on the EVOS projects they manage.

PROJECT DESIGN

A. Objectives

Project managers ensure that projects funded by the Trustee Council are accomplished on time and consistent with the legal and regulatory requirements and the Trustee Council procedures governing each project.

B. Methods

Project managers track project expenditures and status information and provide progress updates to the Trustee Council Office.

C. Cooperating Agencies, Contracts and other Agency Assistance

Organizational and administrative structures vary by agency. Certain projects have multiple agencies involved; others do not. Some projects involve contracts; others do not.
