The United States and the State of Alaska (“the Governments”) jointly provide this notice (“Notice”) of their expenditure of \$7,243,119 from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Investment Fund (“Investment Fund”). The Governments’ natural resource trustee agencies will use these funds for purposes consistent with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by this Court in *United States v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081 CIV (D. Alaska), on August 28, 1991 (“MOA”).

On September 25, 1991, the United States and the State of Alaska settled their claims against the Exxon Corporation, Exxon Shipping Company, Exxon Pipeline Company, and the T/V *Exxon Valdez* arising from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill (“EVOS”). All funds resulting from these settlements were subsequently ordered by this Court to be placed in an interest-bearing account in the Court Registry Investment System (“CRIS”) administered through the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas.

On June 7, 2000, this Court entered its Third Amended Order for Deposit and Transfer of Settlement Proceeds (“Third Amended Order”). The Third Amended Order allows the Governments the option of investing the money in an account outside the United States Treasury. On September 29, 2000, upon application by the Governments, the Court entered an Order Re: Transfer of Funds from the Exxon Valdez Liquidity Account and the Reserve Fund to an Investment Fund Within the Alaska Department of Revenue, Division of Treasury, authorizing transfer of settlement proceeds to an account within the State. On October 5, 2000, all funds and securities were transferred from the CRIS to the Investment Fund. The Third Amended Order further allows the Governments to establish separate sub-accounts within the primary account “as the Trustee Council determines appropriate.” On October 1, 2002, three sub-accounts were created in the Investment Fund: the Research Investment Sub-Account, the Habitat Investment Sub-Account, and the Koniag Investment Sub-Account. These sub-accounts were established to carry out the Trustee Council’s decision in its Resolution of March 1, 1999 to manage separately the remaining assets of the Joint Trust Funds for the specific purposes of funding a long term research and monitoring program, the acquisition of lands along the Karluk River, and the

establishment of a fund to purchase small parcels of land that may become available in the future.¹

Paragraph 27 of the Third Amended Order provides that “funds in an Investment Fund shall remain on deposit in that Fund until such time as the EVOS Trustees unanimously resolve to expend all or part of the funds.” The funds may then be expended, for purposes consistent with the MOA, upon the joint notification of the Governments to the Investment Fund and the Court. The notification is to inform the Court of the proposed uses of the funds in the same manner and to the same extent as was the Governments’ practice when the funds were in the registry of the Court.²

The Governments provide Notice of this seventy-sixth expenditure in the amount of \$6,479,784 from the Research Sub-Account, which includes \$5,454,784 in newly disbursed funds and \$1,025,000 in previously disbursed funds (\$25,000 from the United States Department of the Interior Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration Fund (“DOI NRDAR Account”) and \$1,000,000 from the State of Alaska Department of Fish and Game IRIS Fund 3386) for Fiscal Year 2020 Restoration Projects.³ The Governments also provide Notice of the

expenditure of \$763,335 from the Habitat Sub-Account, which includes \$488,335 in newly disbursed funds and \$275,000 in previously disbursed funds from the DOI NRDAR Account. The expenditures from the Habitat Sub-Account include \$757,885 for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities for the Habitat Program in the Fiscal Year 2020 Work Plan,⁴ as well as \$5,450 for due diligence related to the purchase of the Deep Creek property, parcel KEN 4013.⁵

Of the \$7,243,119 that is the subject of this Notice, \$5,159,584 will be provided to the United States (in addition to \$300,000 in previously disbursed funds), and \$783,535 will be provided to the State of Alaska (in addition to \$1,000,000 in previously disbursed funds).

The Trustee Council has met once since the Governments' filing on September 25, 2019 of their Seventy-Fifth Joint Notice of Expenditures. The Governments will submit the meeting notes for the Trustee Council's last meeting on October 11, 2019, once they have been approved by the Trustee Council. The meeting notes for the Trustee Council's meeting on October 17, 2018 are appended to this Notice as Attachment B.

The *Exxon Valdez* Trustee Council has unanimously determined to expend \$7,243,119 in joint trust funds for restoration purposes consistent with the terms of the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by the federal district court in *United States v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081 CIV (D. Alaska). This expenditure consists of \$488,335 from the Habitat sub-account and \$5,454,784 from the Research sub-account, as well as \$1,300,000 in previously-disbursed funds presently held in the United States' DOI NRDAR Account and the State of Alaska's ADF&G IRIS Fund 3386.

**RESOLUTION 19-02 OF THE EXXON VALDEZ OIL SPILL TRUSTEE COUNCIL
REGARDING FY20 ANNUAL FUNDING**

INCLUDING THE FY20 WORK PLAN OF EVOSTC RESTORATION, RESEARCH, AND MONITORING
PROJECTS; FY20 EVOSTC ANNUAL BUDGET; HABITAT PARCEL & ENHANCEMENT OF KEN 4018;
AND REAUTHORIZATION OF HABITAT ENHANCEMENT PROJECT 18180120.

We, the undersigned, duly authorized members of the *Exxon Valdez* Oil Spill Trustee Council do hereby certify that, in accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered as settlement of *United States of America v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and after public meetings, unanimous agreement has been reached to expend funds received in settlement of *State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.*, No. A91-083 CIV, and *United States of America v. Exxon Corporation, et al.*, No. A91-082 CIV, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska. This funding is for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities as described below.

**SECTION I: FY20 Work Plan of EVOSTC Restoration, Research, and Monitoring Projects and
FY20 EVOSTC Annual Budget**

The total amount of funding approved in Section I is **\$7,237,669**. This funding is approved for February 1, 2020 through January 31, 2021, except where otherwise noted in the documents referenced herein, including the FY20 EVOSTC Annual Budget, dated September 9, 2019. The lead or managing agency for each project must demonstrate to the Executive Director, where applicable, that requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) are met before any project funds may be expended (with the exception of funds to prepare NEPA documentation); and the Principal Investigators for the project must abide by the Council's policies, including those pertaining to data and reporting.

This funding must be spent in accordance with the FY20 Annual Funding Overview (AFO), dated October 31, 2019, and the documents referenced therein including and as described by the FY20 EVOSTC Annual Budget, dated September 9, 2019 and revised October 22, 2019.

SECTION II: HABITAT PARCEL AND HABITAT ENHANCEMENT PROJECTS

A. Funding Authorized in Section II

The total amount of funding approved in Section II is **\$8,719,010** of new funding and **\$3,800,437** of previously approved funding that is reauthorized. Authorization for funding for the purchase of interests in the parcel noted in Section II (B) shall terminate if a purchase agreement is not executed by May 1, 2021. This funding must be spent in accordance with the activities, requirements, conditions and information as described in Section II (B & C).

B. Habitat Parcel Additional Requirements, Conditions and Other Information

The additional requirements, conditions and other information below are in addition to any requirements, conditions or other information in Sections II (A). The Council is approving funding for the acquisition of the Parcel **KEN 4018**, Bookey Parcel, Kenai Peninsula with the purchase of interests in land to be at the fair market value established by an approved appraisal and the total cost of which, including due diligence and closing costs shall not exceed \$2,300,000. The purchase above is further conditioned upon:

1. the provision that the EVOSTC Executive Director, in consultation with the Alaska Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Department of Interior Solicitor's Office and Alaska Department of Law, determines that it is in the interest of the Council to move forward with purchase of the interests in the Parcel; and
2. due diligence reports, which are acceptable to the Alaska Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Department of Interior Solicitor's Office and the Alaska Department of Law.
3. Authorization of funding for the purchase of interests in this Parcel shall terminate if a purchase agreement is not executed by May 1, 2021.

C: Habitat Enhancement Projects

- 1) **ADNR State Parks Eagle Rock Facility Improvements (Bookey) - Project 20200135:**

Funding of **\$6,419,010**, which includes GA, is approved for the ADNR State Parks Eagle Rock Facility Improvements Project on the Bookey Parcel. This funding approval is authorized until May 1, 2021.

2) Copper River Watershed Enhancement Reauthorization - Project 18180120:

The Council reauthorizes **\$3,800,437**, which includes GA, for the reauthorization of the Copper River Watershed Enhancement Project, dated June 2019. This reauthorization approval is authorized until May 1, 2021.

SECTION III: APPROVAL BY COUNCIL

By unanimous consent, we hereby request the Alaska Department of Law and the Assistant Attorney General of the Environment and Natural Resources Division of the United States Department of Justice to take such steps as may be necessary to make available the funding as described in this Resolution.

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

Overview:

This project encompasses the acquisition of a 34.76 acre parcel immediately adjacent to the Alaska State Parks Eagle Rock Boat Launch on the Kenai River. The parcel is located at river mile 11.5 on the lower Kenai River within the zone of the Kenai River Special Management Area. The uplands on the Bookey parcel will be utilized to provide increased recreational opportunities on the Kenai River and expanded opportunities for public access through new road access, floating docks and additional parking adjacent to the Eagle Rock Boat Launch. Wetlands near the river bank will be conserved for their natural habitat values.

The Bookey parcel ranked in the highest priority category in the 2014 EVOSTC Habitat Land Prioritization compiled by Great Land Trust. The parcel has approximately 630 feet of Kenai Spur Road frontage, 755 feet of Kenai River frontage, a shared 660 feet boundary with the Eagle Rock Boat Launch parcel, which was a prior EVOSTC-funded purchase. There are 29 acres of uplands and 5.76 acres of wetlands on the property. The attached maps show the location of the property and the surrounding land ownership.

The Bookey parcel is a Native Allotment and the transaction must be approved by both BIA and the Native Allottee and follow BIA requirements for land sales.

Added Benefit to Past EVOS Trustee Council Actions:

Between 1994 and 2006 there have been 12 small parcel acquisitions on the Kenai River. The Bookey property is adjacent to the Eagle Rock Boat Launch, which was approved and funded by EVOSTC resolution 11-13 dated September 15, 2011, and thus builds on past EVOSTC efforts. The Eagle Rock Boat Launch parcel is managed by ADNR/Alaska State Parks. The Kenai River frontage between the two parcels is continuous.

Protection Benefits:

The Bookey parcel provides habitat for EVOS injured species. It includes freshwater riparian wetlands providing habitat for migratory birds, marine mammals, and anadromous fish. Waterfowl, shorebirds, Bald Eagles and raptors use this area for feeding, nesting, and staging. The property will be managed by Alaska State Parks consistent with the Kenai River Special Management Area. The parcel uplands will be developed for improvements to recreational

opportunities along the river through improved parking and access to the Eagle Rock Boat Launch. The parcel's uplands have recreational development potential and could be a location for developing a new Alaska State Parks visitor center in the future.

Potential Threats:

The parcel contains desirable Kenai River frontage, views, and uplands. The parcel could be subdivided into small house lots with exclusively private Kenai River access.

Proposed Management:

Fee simple to State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources, to be managed by the Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation, and with conservation easement to be held by BLM.

Funding Request: Not to Exceed \$2,300,000, including due diligence and closing costs. The final purchase price will be determined upon completion of the appraisal.



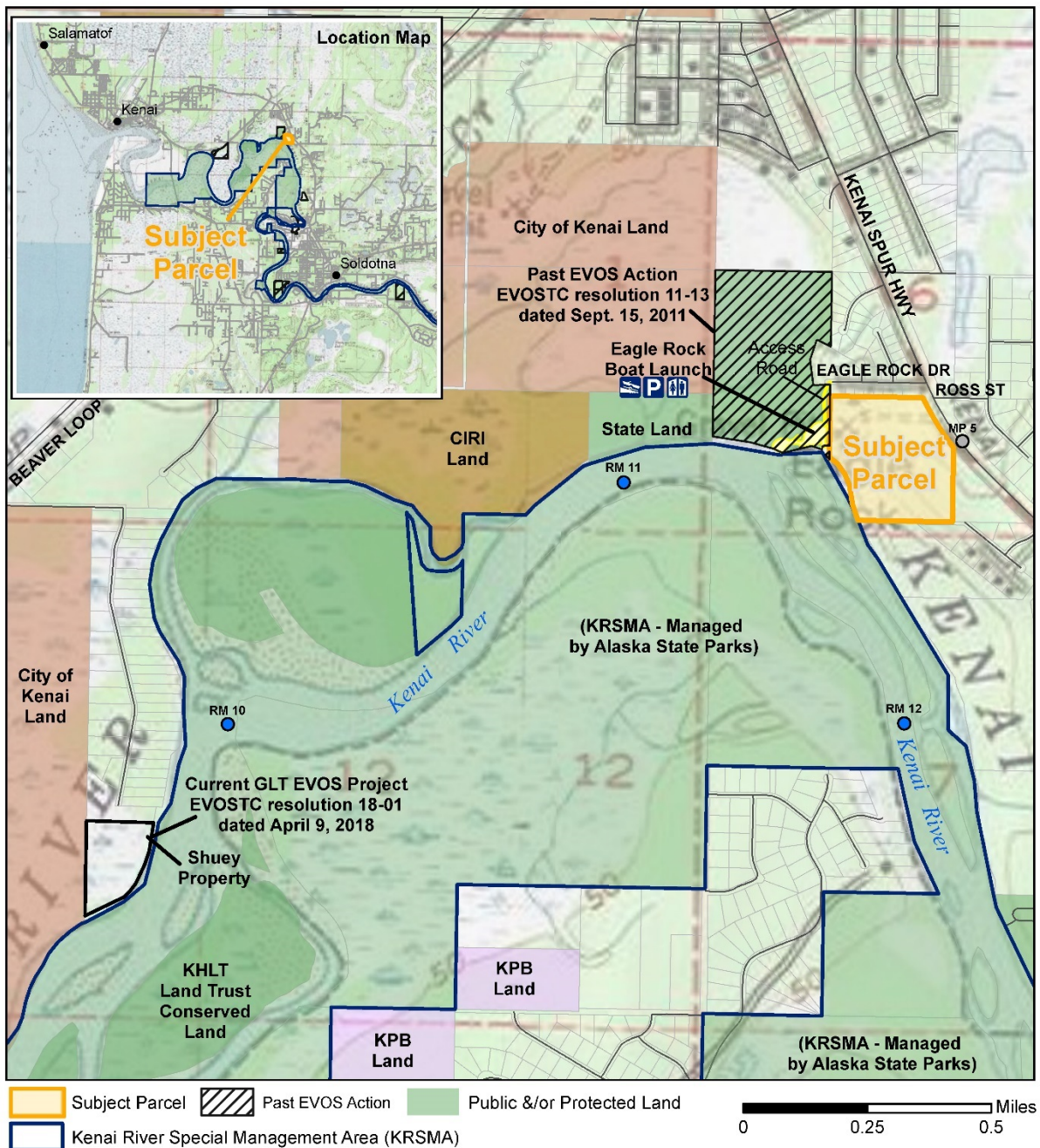

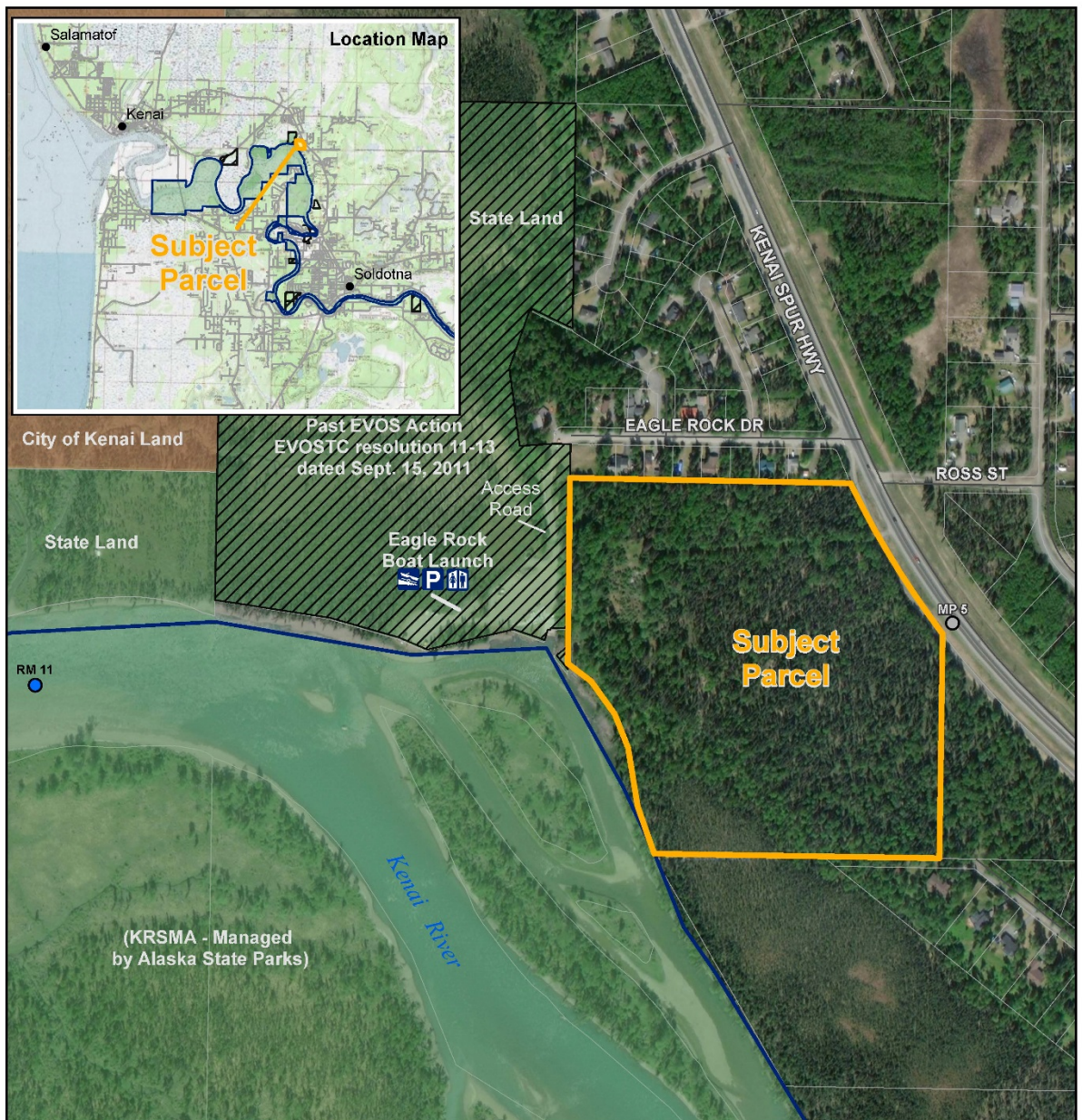

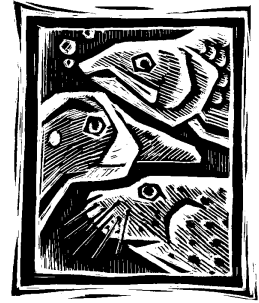
