The meeting convened at 10:02 a.m., October 14, 2020 using the Zoom conferencing platform.

1. Approval of the October 14, 2020 meeting agenda

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to approve the draft October 14, 2020 meeting

agenda dated October 13, 2020.

Motion by Vincent-Lang, second by Balsiger, approved

unanimously.

2. Approval of February 28, 2020 meeting notes

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to approve the draft February 28, 2020 Trustee

unanimously.

# 3. Approval of Annual Investment Fund Asset Allocation

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to adopt the Asset Allocation recommended by

the Investment Working Group, Mix Number 4 on page 12 of the Alaska Department of Revenue's March 31, 2020 presentation for the period of February 1, 2021

through January 31, 2022.

Motion by Vincent-Lang, second by Mulder, approved

unanimously.

#### 4. Discussion: Can EVOSTC Funds be Given to an Endowment

The Council heard presentations from the US Department of Justice and Alaska Department of Law and from five individuals representing the Think Tank and discussed the proposal.

Public Comment: Twelve additional public comments were received.

# 5. <u>Discussion: Draft Resolutions A and B: Changing Annual Meeting and Reporting Requirements, and Allowing Multi-Year Funding of Projects</u>

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to initiate a 60-day comment period on draft

Resolutions A & B to amend the 1994 Restoration Plan

to eliminate the annual meeting and reporting requirements, to establish a new five- or ten-year, multi-year meeting cycle, to allow flexibility for multi-year funding of projects, and to make non-substantive updates to the 1994 Restoration Plan, as appropriate

to effectuate these changes.

Motion by Vincent-Lang, second by Mulder, approved

unanimously.

# 6. <u>Discussion: Draft Resolution C: Combining Habitat and Research Accounts</u>

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to initiate a 60-day comment period on draft

Resolution C which would approve initiation of the steps to transfer the EVOSTC Trust Funds from the separate Restoration and Habitat sub-accounts into a single account to be used in accordance with the requirements of the Memorandum of Agreement and

Consent Decree entered as settlement of *United States* of *America v. State of Alaska*, No. A91-081

Motion by Vincent-Lang, second by Mulder, approved unanimously.

# 7. <u>Discussion: Draft Resolutions D: Changing Spill Area Boundary</u>

APPROVED MOTION:

A) Motion to initiate a 60-day comment period on Draft Resolution D to amend the Restoration Plan to incorporate an ecosystem approach to extend the oil spill boundary.

Motion by Schmid, second by Vincent-Lang, approved unanimously.

B) Bering River Coal Fields

Trustee Schmid led a discussion of a proposal for a habitat protection purchase 11,000 acres of coal rights in the Bering River area, outside of the current boundaries of the spill area. No motion was made.

# 8. <u>Invitation – Focus Areas and Invitation development</u>

APPROVED MOTION:

Motion to approve the Draft FY22-31 Ten Year Invitation, dated 10-02-20, and direct publication and the public solicitation of proposals as set forth and described in the Invitation. The Science Director may refine the education and outreach component and make additional non-substantive revisions throughout, as needed before publication.

Motion by Vincent-Lang, second by Mulder, amendment proposed by Balsinger, second by Schmid, to move the mandatory requirement in Item V.A.4, subsection A, "Partner with both Centers of Excellence" to V.B.1, subsection B, stating it as a preference instead of as mandatory. The amendment was approved unanimously, and the motion as amended was then also adopted unanimously.

# 9. Discussion: Unsolicited Proposals

Public comment was received from the requesters of eight unsolicited proposals listed on the agenda and there was further Trustee discussion of the Think Tank Proposal.

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to approve up to \$500,000 in matching funds

for a 50/50 (1:1) match with other funding verified as

raised by the Alaska SeaLife Center for its

infrastructure proposal, for any of the items within the scope of project 21210130. Funding is approved for 18

months (until May 1, 2022).

unanimously.

APPROVED MOTION: Motion to encourage the Think Tank lawyers

and Department of Justice and Department of Law to sit down and collaboratively discuss

their different positions.

Motion by Schmid, second by Renkes.

Motion by Mulder, second by Balsiger, to table the previous Think Tank motion. Approved

unanimously.

APPROVED MOTION: Motion by Mulder, second by Balsiger, to

accept the Think Tank's June 2020 proposal for

an alternative structure consisting of

transferring the remaining unencumbered

Trust Funds to the Alaska Community
Foundation and for the Foundation, as they
proposed in their proposal, to make the
decisions on how the money is spent in the
future. Several individual Trustees expressed

opposition to the motion. Motion failed for

lack of unanimity.

- provided that the EVOSTC Executive
   Director, in consultation with the Alaska
   Department of Natural Resources, U.S.
   Department of Interior Solicitor's Office and
   Alaska Department of Law, determines that
   it is in the interest of the Council to move
   forward with purchase of interests in the
   Parcel.

Authorization of funding for the purchase of interests in the Parcel shall terminate if a purchase agreement is not executed by May 1, 2022.

B) Motion to reauthorizing funding of up to \$6,419,010, which includes GA, for FY21 funding of the ADNR State Parks Eagle Rock Facility Improvements

Project 20200135, on the Bookey Parcel, proposal

dated August 16, 2019.
